

# Skipopia Premium Theme – Documentation

## ***Introduction***

Skipopia is a premium theme designed for business/commerce use (although it could easily be changed to a portfolio). It contains a simple 5 page design including a homepage, normal page, products page and a contact page. Some of the main features of Skipopia are:

- 3 Colour Schemes (Blue, Green, Red)
- jQuery Cycle Prodcut Scroller on front page
- jQuery Lightbox plugin for Products
- Styled Contact Form
- PSD's included (One per colour)
- Valid XHTML and CSS
- Browser Compatibility –IE7, Firefox, Safari, and Chrome

## ***General Editing***

Most of the things covered in this section come under basic HTML knowledge. To find out more about HTML and basic editing of pages then go to <http://www.w3schools.com/html/default.asp>.

## ***Adding/Changing Links***

To add a link choose a bit of text and put the following around the text:

```
<a href="http://www.mylink.com">The text I selected</a>
```

## ***Changing Colours***

To change any of the colours in the template open up a CSS file in the styles folder (in this case the styles are split into different files). As an example you can change the link colour by changing the following code:

```
a, a:visited {
    color:#20333F;
    text-decoration:none;
    border-bottom:1px solid #3E9ED9;
}
```

Replace the HEX values with your own colours.

## Template Editing

This section includes template specific editing.

### Changing the Template Images

The images in this theme are split into their own folders by colour. For example to change the header image in the blue theme you would open the file “images\blue\header.png”. Edit and save this file.

An easier way to change the colours of template images would be to open up the corresponding PSD file (e.g. PSD\TemplateBlue.psd) and edit that file. When saving the file use slices and then overwrite the current theme files in the images folder.

### Changing the Product Images

The product images are stored in the “images” folder. Each product has a normal and small version (noted by \_small at the end of the filename). The normal version is used on the homepage scroller and in the lightbox popup on the product page. The small versions are used as the thumbnails on the products page. You can name the product images anything you want **but** remember to change the corresponding names in the HTML.

### Changing the Homepage Scroller

The HTML for the homepage scroller is defined in “index.html”. Look for the following code:

```
<div id="middlebar-big">
  <div class="product">
    <h2>Hey! This is the Product<br />you've been waiting
    for!</h2>
    <p>You know it. Stop messing around<br />and lets get
    down to business.</p>
    <p><a href="products.html">Read More &raquo;</a></p>
    
  </div>
  <div class="product">
    <h2>You don't believe me?</h2>
    <p>You know it. Stop messing around<br />and lets get
    down to business.<br />Get started...</p>
    <p><a href="products.html">Read More &raquo;</a></p>
    
  </div>
  <div class="product">
    <h2>Well you really should!</h2>
    <p>You know it. Stop messing around<br />and lets get
    down to business.<br />Get started...</p>
    <p><a href="products.html">Read More &raquo;</a></p>
    
  </div>

Here you can change the title (in the <h2> tags), the product description (in the <p> tags) and the image. You can add as many feature products as you would like by copying the <div class="product"> (and its contents) and pasting it at the end of the list of div's.

You can also change the jQuery Cycle settings in the head section of index.html. Look for:

```
<script type="text/javascript">
$(document).ready(function(){
    $('#middlebar-big').cycle({
        fx: 'fade',
        speed: 600,
        timeout: 3000,
        pause: 1
    });
});
</script>
```

Here you can change the settings of the scroller. For more information see the website <http://malsup.com/jquery/cycle/>
